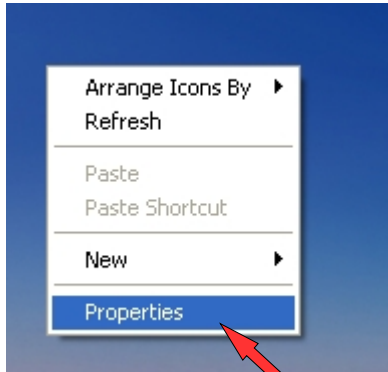




DESKTOP CLEANUP WIZARD

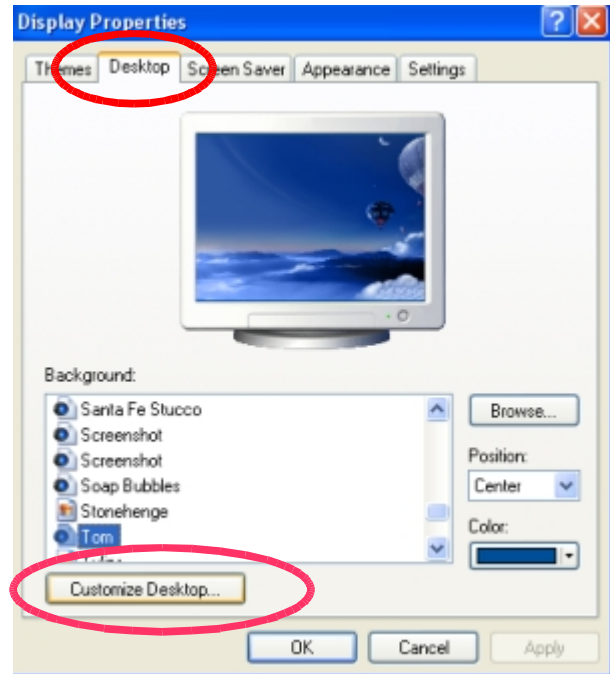
Microsoft always had a thing about untidy Desk-Tops on your computer. When you first started Windows XP there was only the waste bin visible. When you saved items or had shortcut Icons placed on your Desk-Top when installing software the Desk-Top started to look untidy, (by Microsoft's standard).

The programmers of Windows XP built in a **Desktop Cleanup Wizard** that activated every 60 days. It cleans up Icons you haven't use in the last 60 days and places them in a folder. You can turn this feature off.....

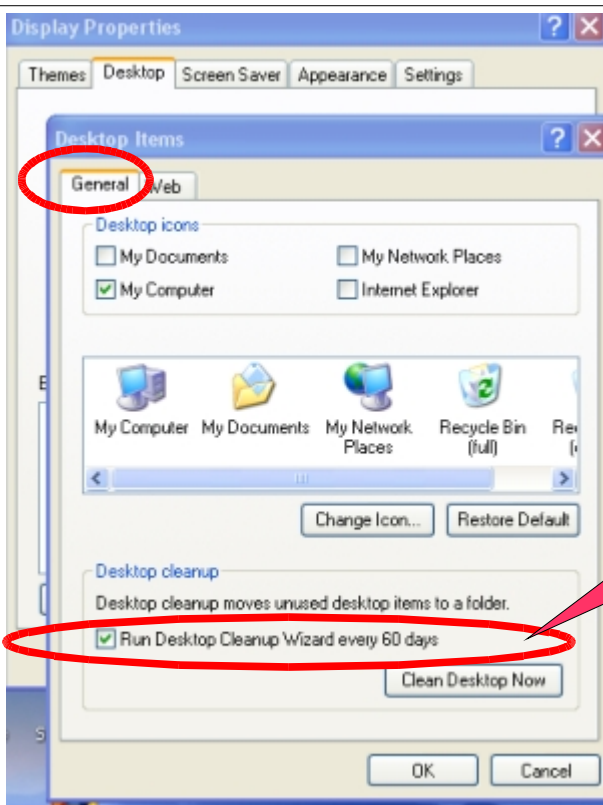


Right-click your desktop, then select "Properties"

The "Display Properties" screen will show.



Click the "Desktop" tab, then with a quick flick of your mouse, tap the "Customize Desktop" button



A new screen will pop up, labeled appropriately enough, **"Desktop Items"**.

Look towards the bottom of that screen and uncheck the "Run Desktop Cleanup Wizard every 60 days" check box. This ends the career of **Mr. Clean-up Wizard**.
