



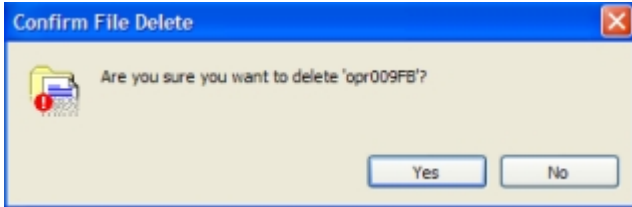

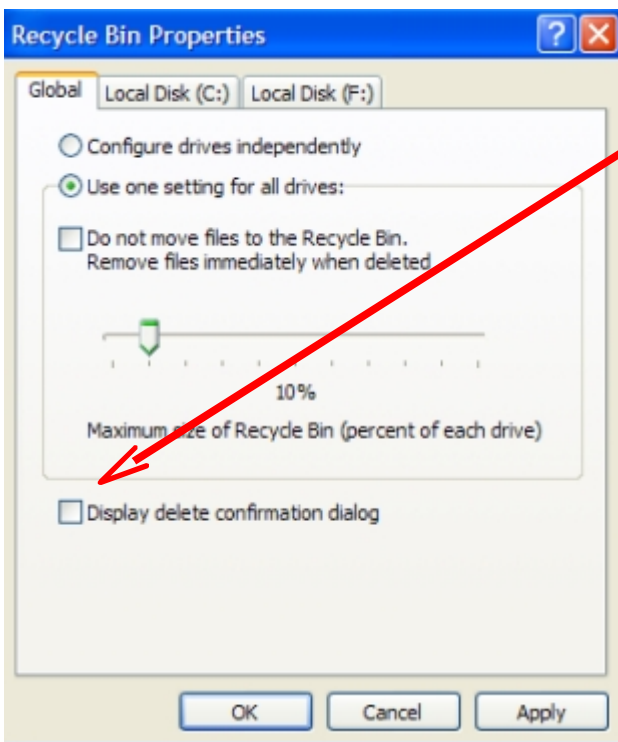
Windows Recycle Bin



Notice when you delete something, Windows asks you if you would really like to do it? You then need to click **YES**, if you are convertible when deleting files, then you may want to disable the deletion confirmation.



To do so, just right-click the **Recycle bin**, left click **Properties**, and De-select the checkbox for "Display delete confirmation dialog."



Note: This only applies to deleting a files from Windows Explorer.

Right clicking the Recycle bin to empty it's contents will still ask for a confirmation before deleting it's contents.

Recycle Size:

By default, the Recycle Bin sucks up a percentage of your hard drive. If you have a 500 gig hard drive, Windows is setting aside around 5 gig just for digital garbage. You can adjust this to take up more or less space based on the size of your HDD. Windows Vista even allows you to specify how much you want the recycle bin to reserve by entering an exact number.
