




Hidden XP program files.

For some reason, Windows XP dose not list the Clipboard Viewer and there is no Clipboard Viewer icon appearing on the program menu list. Although it can be accessed from Windows Word 2003 from [Edit] [Office Clipboard].

It can be a handy way to see exactly what's on your clipboard or delete its contents.

==== Place something on the clipboard by using Copy from within a program or just press the Print Screen button.

To open the 'Clipboard program follow the steps below.




(1) Click [Start] button. (2) Then click [Run...].

In the 'Open' command prompt Type **clipbrd.exe** and click [OK]
The Clipboard program will open and show what is on the Clipboard.

Another hidden program for those with some artistic talent is the Font Editor.

Once again open the [Run] command using the steps (1) & (2) above.

In the 'Open' command prompt Type **eudefedit.exe** and click [OK]



Select Character Click [OK]

Draw your character using the tools shown.
Save character from the [File] menu.
Click [Yes]

In the Font link box click the radio button **Link with Selected fonts.**
Then click save.

The next step in actually using the custom font. It can only be accessed from the Character Map.

Click [Start] – [Accessories] – [System Tools] – [Character map] The font will be listed as "All Fonts (Private Characters)". Select the custom font and click "Copy". That places it in the clipboard where it can be pasted into any document in the regular way.
