

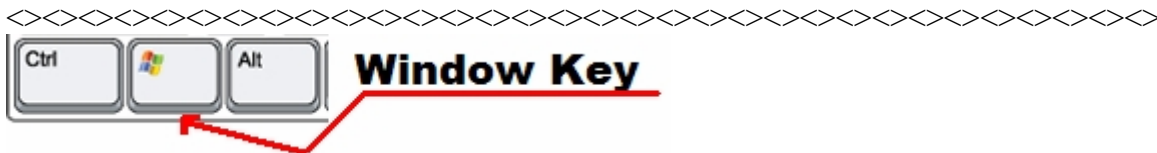
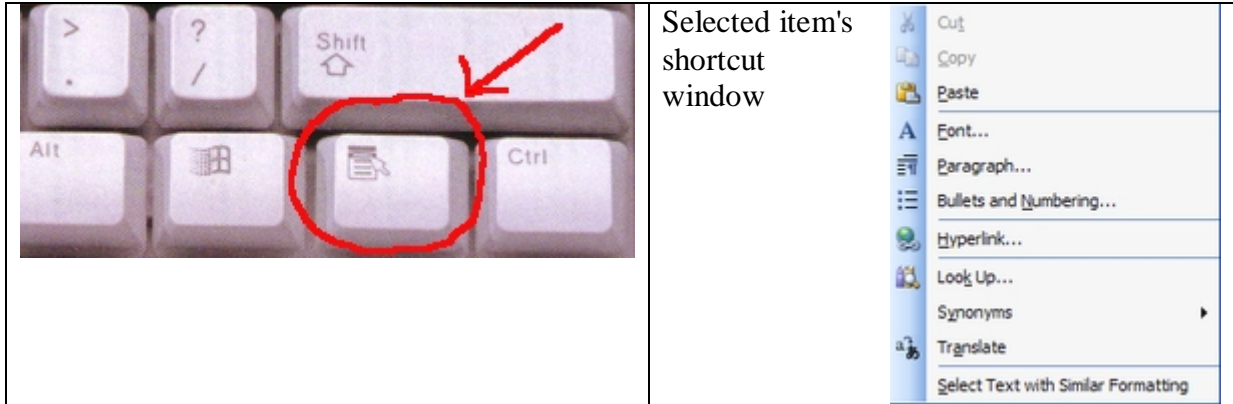




Question on Software or Operating system.

Special Keys on our Keyboards.

The Application key has an image of a mouse pointer on a menu (between the Alt and Ctrl keys (⌘) to the right of your Space Bar). Depressing this key will display the selected item's shortcut window. This is the menu that is displayed by right-clicking.



On either side of the spacebar, outside the Alt key, is a key with the Windows logo. Holding the Windows key down and pressing another key will launch quite a few actions. Some of the more common are listed in the table below:

-  Displays the Start Menu.
-  +  Minimizes all windows and shows the Desktop.
-  +  Opens a new Explorer Window. The hottest Windows keyboard shortcuts.
-  +  Displays the Find all files dialog box.
-  +  Lock your Windows XP computer. Logoff in Windows Pre-XP.
-  +  Minimizes all open windows.
-  +  Displays the Run command.
-  +  Displays the Windows Help menu.
-  +  Displays the Systems Properties dialog box.
