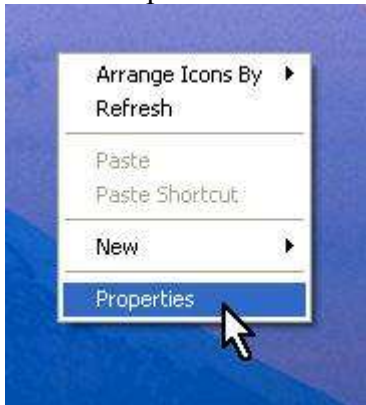
## How to Change your Screen Saver

When the computer is left on but not in use, the unchanging image on the screen can be burned into the face of a cathode-ray tube monitor. The newer, thin, flat-screen monitors are not affected by this. To prevent this damage, you can choose to use a screen saver, which constantly changes the image on the screen when the computer is not in use. Windows XP provides a number of alternative screen savers you can use.

### To Pick a New Screen Saver.

With Windows XP displaying the DeskTop, move to a blank area of your DeskTop and **Right Click** the mouse button.

The desktop context menu will open.



Left click Properties option.

Left click the **Screen Saver** tab.

Click on the down arrow to make a new selection.

The example below is a Slideshow of your own pictures. Click on Slideshow and a preview will show. The images are chosen by default of pictures in My Pictures folder.

You can change the folder by clicking on **Settings**.



In the **My Pictures Screen Saver Option** menu change the settings to your preference or use the [ Browse ] button to choose a new folder with your pictures.

Click OK and return to Display Properties menu and click Apply then OK and close.
