

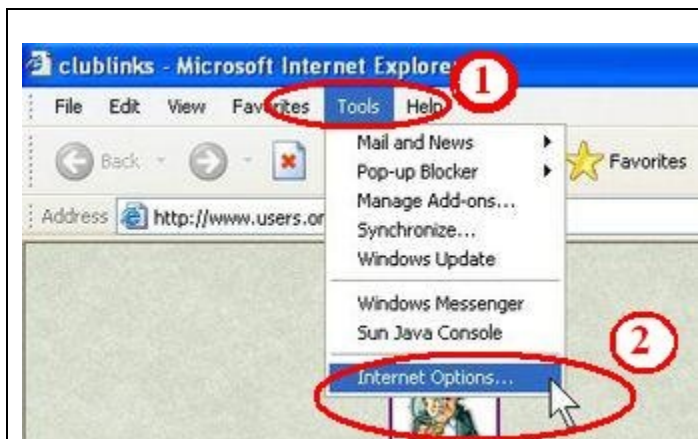

Reduce Temporary Internet File Space.

The temporary internet file clutters your hard drive with copies of each page visited. These can build up over time and take up disk space. The idea to store internet web sites temporarily is to speed up you link when logging onto the same site. Instead of getting a new page each time you visit that site, IE often takes the page out of the **Temporary Internet** files. This can be a problem if you are viewing a website that is updated all the time. If you are on a slow connection such as a 56K or lower then this can be good but if you are on a fast broadband connection, then you can get away with decreasing the size of your **Temporary Internet** files to just one meg without any performance decrease.

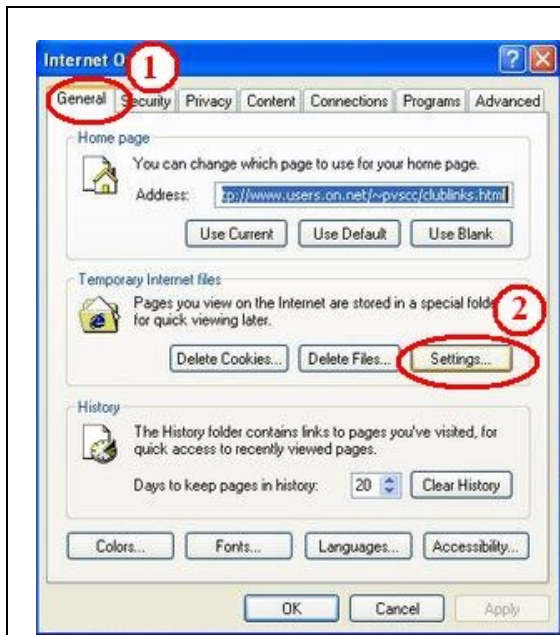


To change the **Temporary Internet** file size,

[*] Open Internet Explorer.

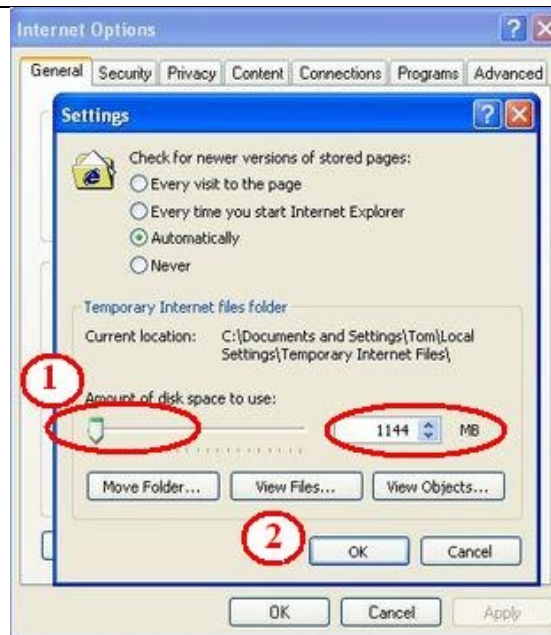
[1] Select [Tools]

[2] Click [Internet Options]



Click the [General] Tab.

Click the [Settings] Button.



Slide the slider to about 1 meg Then click [OK].



To obtain information on the other options in the [Settings] window, left click the question mark [?] and drag the arrow cursor with the question mark to that option as shown on the left. Information on that option will be displayed.
