A rootkit is a set of software tools (or programs) intended to conceal them selves while your Windows XP is running its operating files or system data. In other words it's a type of virus. Rootkits have in recent years been used increasingly by malware to help intruders maintain access to systems while avoiding detection.

GRISOFT (AVG anti virus software) today introduced a new, free product aimed at the detection and removal of Rootkits.

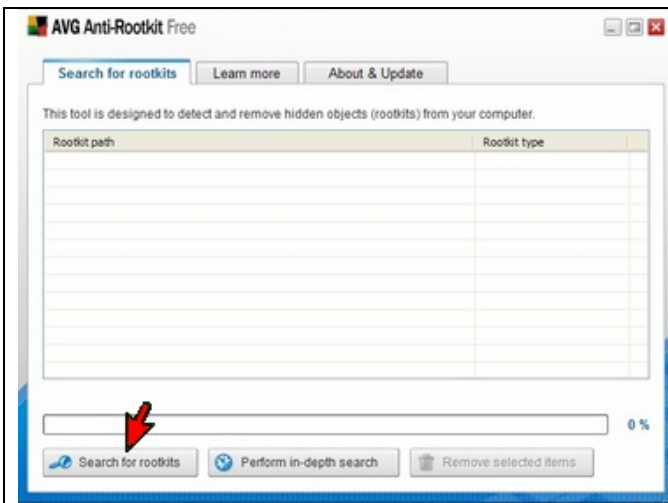
Rootkits are a specific type of malware which hide in other applications or a computer's operating system or device drivers. They allow malicious applications to collect passwords and sensitive data from the infected computer without the user's knowledge, this can be used for personal information theft, spam relay and other criminal activities.
