

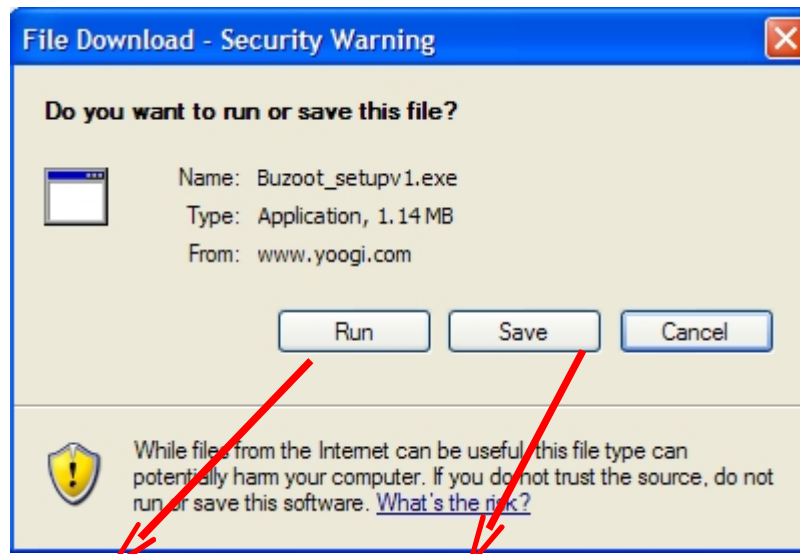

What is the difference between RUN and SAVE?

When you are downloading a file off the internet you may get the option to "Run" or "Save". Either of these options will lead you to the setup for the program and install it on your computer.



Which should I choose **Run** or **Save**?

By choosing "Run" the setup process starts once the setup file is **downloaded** to your temporary internet folder. Remember it downloads to a temporary folder.

The file is then run, exactly as if you had used Windows Explorer to navigate to the temporary location into which it had been downloaded and then double-clicked on it.

I feel it is best to download to your Desktop or a special download folder and install it from there.

You can save the download file onto a USB drive or CD and share with others or keep the file as a backup for future use.

One important thing to note about using Run: the file was downloaded into a temporary location, and it may eventually be deleted.

In either case you are still using your Internet download quota.
