

Set your computer clock automatically

The computer clock came gradually become inaccurate. Windows XP can automatically synchronize the computer clock over the Internet to keep it accurate.

To have the computer configure your clock automatically using an Internet time server follow the steps below.

1. Right click your clock
2. Click [Adjust Date/Time]

Ensure you are in the correct time Zone.

1. Click on [Internet Time]
2. Choose a Server
3. Left click [Update Now] button.
4. Click [Apply] then [OK]

There are two choices in the [Server] options.

1. **time.windows.com**
2. **time.nist.gov**

Choose the one that works with your connection.

Notice the script displayed below the [Update Now] button.

The time has been successfully synchronize with the windows.com on 18/03/2007 at 2:20 PM.

*This is a notification that your clock has been synchronize. If you receive an error notice then either change the Internet server to **time.nist.gov** or check that you are connected to the Internet.*

There is also a notice when then next automatic clock synchronization will take place. (about a week apart).
