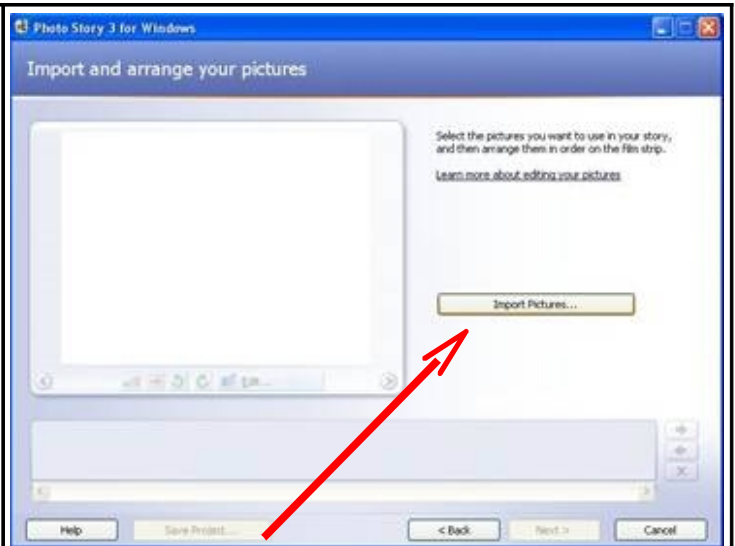


BASIC INSTRUCTIONS ON USING PHOTO STORY 3 FOR WINDOWS

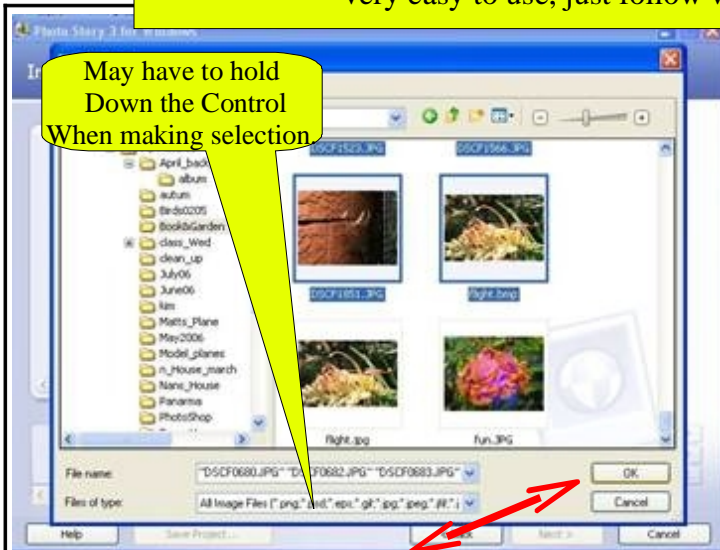


The program is very easy to use. Start by clicking, Begin a new Story. Click [Next].

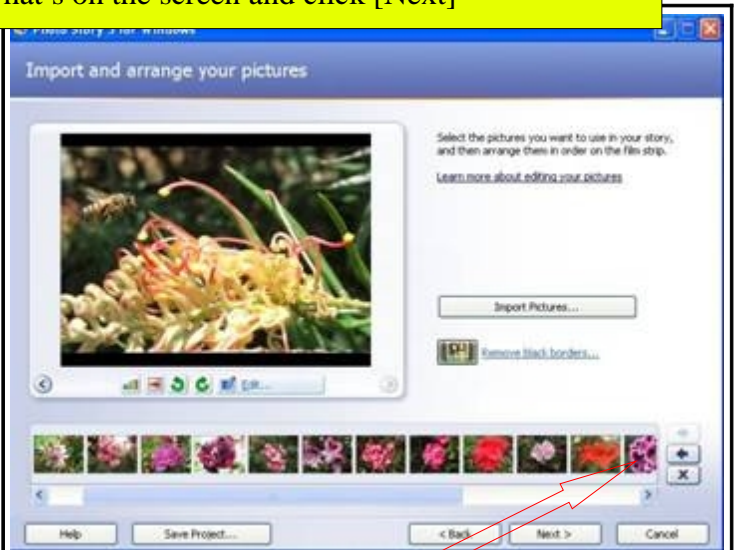


Click on [Import Pictures].

Very easy to use, just follow what's on the screen and click [Next]



Select pictures then click [OK].

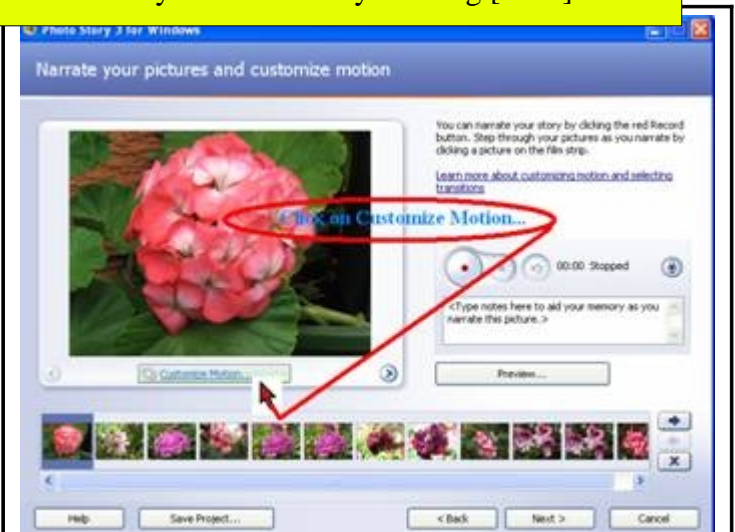


Drag the images in the story line to compile a story. Or select image and use [Arrow] to move image. Click [Next].

Each step in the process of building your 'Picture Story' is followed by clicking [Next].

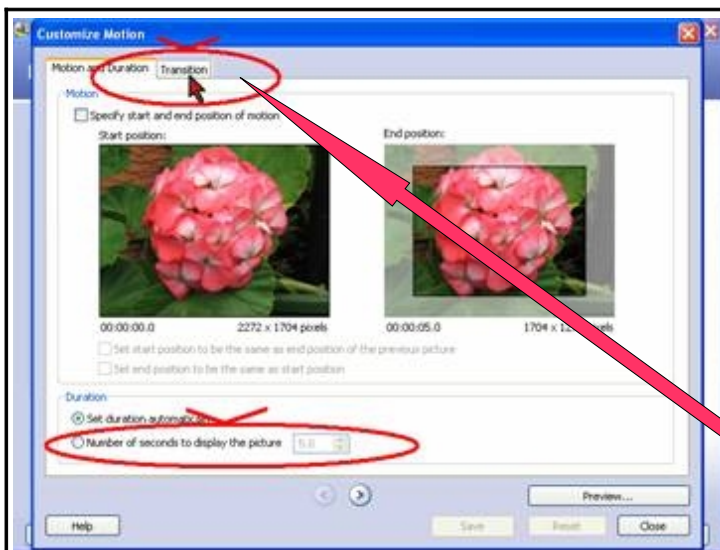


You can add text to any image. [Next].

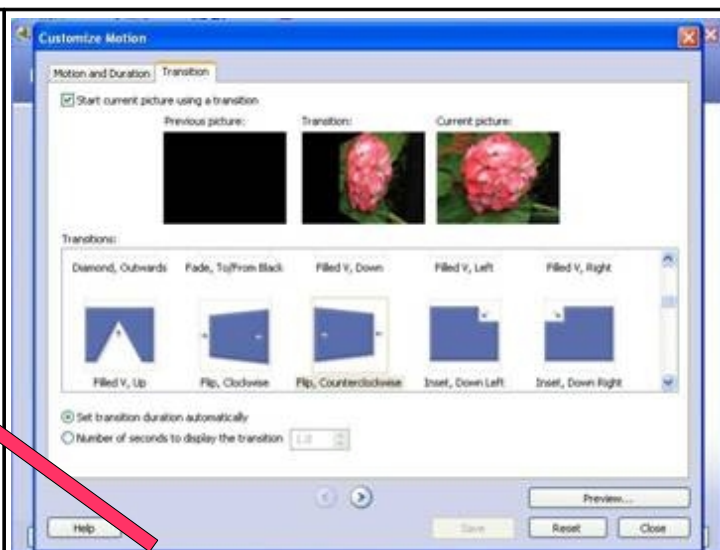


Two options, add voice over or [Customize Motion].

The commentary for that image holds the image on the screen for the duration of the commentary.



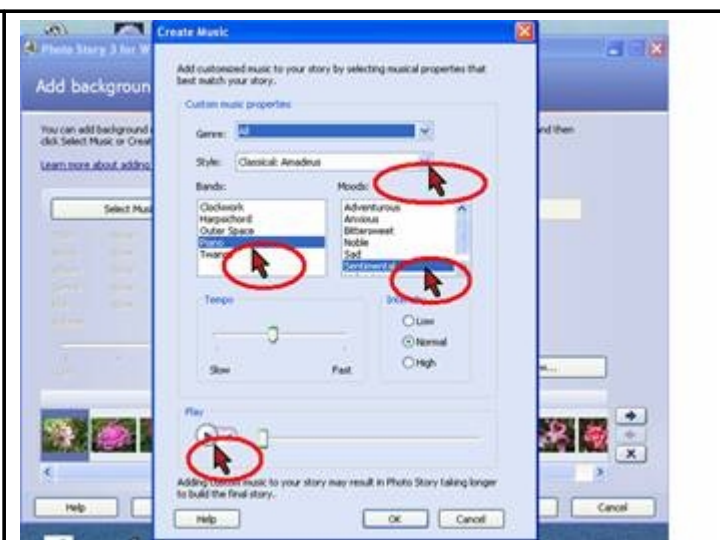
Motion and Duration settings.



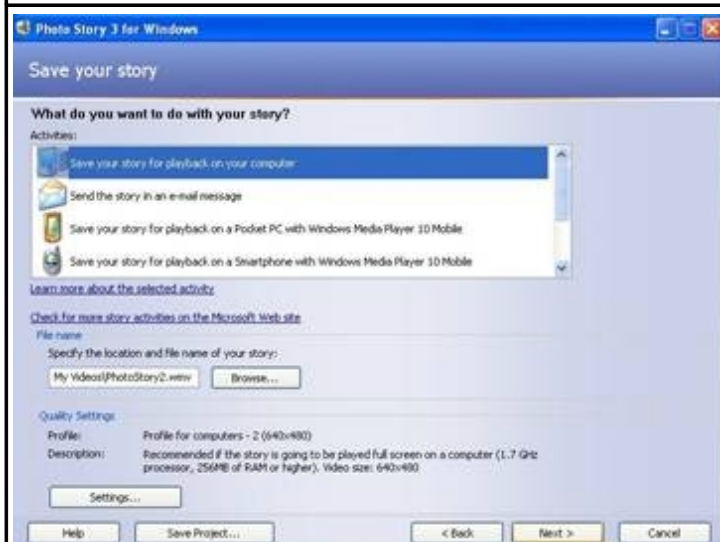
Click [Transition] tab to choose transition for that image.



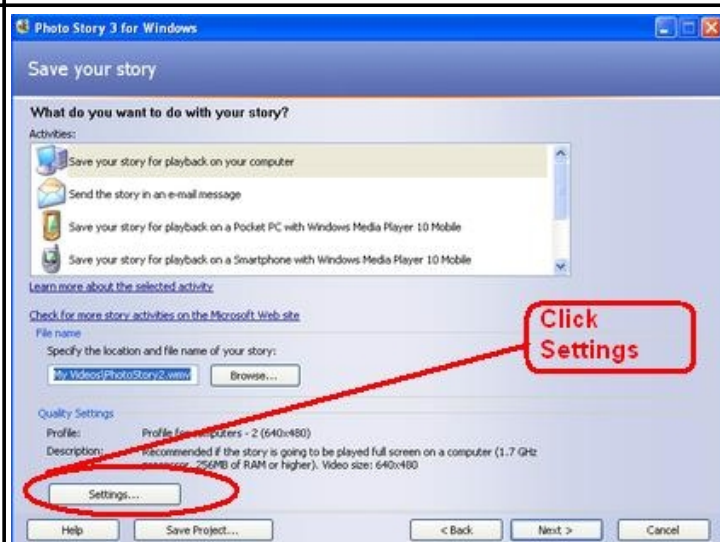
Click [Select Music] or [Create Music]



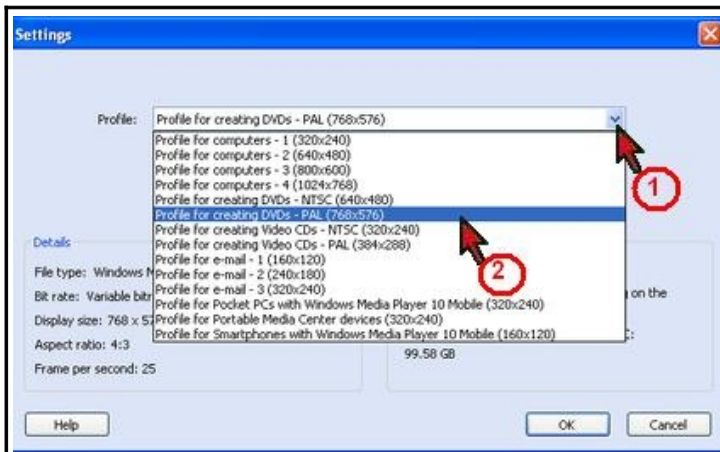
Choose music type for slide show.



Final stages of building 'Photo Story'.
Select one of the options. Note the folder your movie file is saved in. Click [Next].

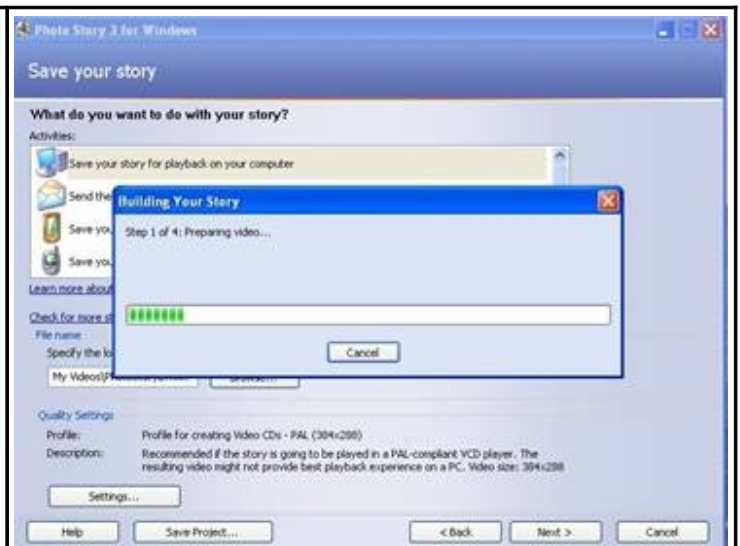


Click on the [Settings] button.



Choose the profile setting for DVD PAL as shown above.

Click [OK] then on the [Next] button.



Building of your story is now in progress.

The [Next] button after building is completed, gives you the option to Play your 'Story' or 'Begin a new Story'.

The compiling of the video and sound files may take a while, this depends on the size of your story.

A special note on the saved file. Even though you chose DVD Pal (profile) to build a file with a display size of 768 x 576 the file is saved in Windows default format, .wmv (Windows Movie Video). This format can only be played on a Windows computer. Although some newer DVD players can play the format.

A converter program is required to change the .wmv (Windows Movie Video) over to an mpeg2 video file.

Any Video Converter is a good choice. (found on our club CD).
